## RECENT EVENTS

**Saturday 18 May** -- GHS was represented at the launch of *Morgan Jones - Man of Conscience* (by Wayne David MP) in Caerphilly (see photograph).

**GHS May meeting** – At the 2018 AGM, GHS Chair suggested an annual Gelligaer Parish talk as a way of helping to meet the stated aims of the Society. This, the first of such talks, was given by Annie Owen and outlined the history of Pantywaun, a small community in north of Gelligaer parish.

*Gelligaer*, the Society's journal, issue 26 carries her article on Pantywaun and district.

**Friday 21 June** -- GHS was represented at Merthyr Historical Society's event in Red House, Merthyr Tydfil, to celebrate the 90<sup>th</sup> birthday of Dr. Fred Holley.

**GHS June meeting** -- GHS members and friends gathered at Llancaiach Fawr at 6 pm to help GHS Life Member, Dr. Fred Holley, celebrate his 90<sup>th</sup> birthday. The number of people present and the sentiments conveyed in the short speeches reflect the respect the Society has for this valuable longstanding member. He was accompanied by his wife, Vida, and son, John, both of whom have given good service to the Society.

The AGM followed at 7 pm, after which GHS member Dr. Stuart Broomfield gave an illustrated talk *Dramatis personae in the story of Llewelyn Bren – their fortunes and fate*. A plaque to the memory of Llewelyn Bren will be erected in Gelligaer during winter 2019-2020.

**Wednesday 4 September** – GHS members were among those who gathered in St. Catwg's Church, Gelligaer, for a cheese and wine reception (when the church records were available for local and family history research) before crossing the road to the Church Hall in time for the 7.30 pm start of the performance of *St Catwg and the Drowned Boys*, a play based on the life of St. Catwg.

Written by Welsh playwright Vic Mills and performed by a small group of young actors, the play gave the audience an insight into the life and work of this early saint. The production was sponsored by the University of South Wales.

N.B. – Readers may be interested to know that the church is open most Saturday mornings (between 10 am and noon) if they wish to consult the church records for family and local history research.

**Thursday 5 September** – following an invitation from Ystrad Mynach Library, GHS gave a talk to a large and interested audience in Ystrad Mynach Library at 11.30 am. The talk, focusing on the history of Ystrad Mynach and illustrated by extracts from Yates' map of Glamorgan (1799), parish tithe maps, large scale OS maps (1879, 1900 and 1919), aimed to help residents and others set their

knowledge of the village in its historical context. This was a good opportunity to showcase GHS and its work to the Ystrad Mynach community. Thanks to Helen and Alex of the Library Service for making this possible.

**GHS September meeting** – As this was the opening meeting of GHS 2019-20 session, the evening started with tea/coffee and biscuits at 6.15 pm. Members, both existing and new, as well as visitors, enjoyed some social time and took advantage of the opportunity to buy the new *Gelligaer* Volume 26. At 7 pm, Les James gave his fascinating talk on Chartist, Zephaniah Williams. Les has researched many aspects of the history of Chartism and is an acknowledged master of information about the events and personalities. We look forward to his forthcoming publication which will shed new light on the life and work of Zephaniah Williams.

**Saturday 12 October** -- Thanks to those members of GHS who helped man the stand and represent GHS at Glamorgan Family History Society Annual Fair at Merthyr Leisure Centre. Although it was relatively quiet, GHS sold 10 of its publications and was able to offer constructive help on the local and family history queries of a number of visitors to GHS stand.

**GHS October meeting** – A sizeable audience gathered for the talk by Huw Williams, Dowlais. Delivered with his usual enthusiasm and clarity, the talk was full of information about Peterloo 1819, Merthyr 1831 and Merthyr Chartists 1839.

**Saturday 2 November** – Thanks to the members of GHS who helped man the stand and represent the Society at the 2019 Chartist Convention in St. Woolos Cathedral, Newport.

### **BARGOED EMPORIUM**

The painting *BARGOED EMPORIUM*, a 1980 work by Rhymney-born artist, Olwen Hughes, was gifted to Gelligaer Historical Society by Mrs Christine Findlay, whose grandmother had worked in Bargoed Emporium about a century ago. As reported in *Gelligaer Times* 40, GHS presented the painting to Bargoed Town Council for display in the Town Hall. The Clerk of Bargoed Town Council has sent this photograph which shows it in place. ### **GHS PROJECTS**

**GHS WWI project** closed in winter 2018-19, but the database of names on local war memorials is still on the Society website and any additional information available can be added.

**GHS Diamond project** will run until the Society celebrates this milestone in 2021-22 season. Some members and friends are researching aspects of life and work in various parts of the parish during the nineteenth century in preparation for a publication in Diamond Jubilee year. More volunteer researchers will be welcome. Readers with access to the internet may like to look at some of the websites listed below for information about local people and places in the nineteenth century, a century that saw industrialisation and urbanisation roll southwards through the parish. ### **Treharris Remembers – Treharris yn Cofio [merthyr.history@gmail.com](mailto:merthyr.history@gmail.com)**

Readers may be interested in this extract from a post on the blog *The Melting Pot*.

A small community group is creating a public record: -

- *to commemorate those people who lost their lives during the 1939-45 World War who were associated with the Treharris Ward area of the Merthyr Tydfil County Borough, and who have been recorded in records and on War Memorials throughout the world, as a result of their deaths during that period as a result of enemy actions or whilst in the service of their country.*



- to record information for wider public and educational purposes so that this current generation and future generations will have information and stories to understand how people in their community died in one of the deadliest conflicts in recent history, and the impact on their families and community.
- to produce an exhibition of information, photographs and other media in time for the Commemoration of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the end of the 1939-45 World War, to complete the Project by 4 May 2020.






