RECENT EVENTS

GHS November meeting – GHS member, Carwyn Hughes, gave an interesting presentation entitled *Patagonia, where Welsh meet Spanish, 1865-2019*. His in-depth knowledge of the geography and history of the area coupled with his penetrating conversations with local people during a recent visit to Patagonia, made this a very worthwhile talk.

GHS December meeting – There was a short illustrated talk *Gelbygaer's underground Tramways* by Greg Buick and a Christmas quiz devised by GHS vice chair, Judith Jones. The attendance was disappointing but not unexpected in view of the cold weather and members' many other commitments at this time of year.

Thanks to committee members, Ann Pinch and Susan Price, for assisting with serving tea/coffee and mince pies, and to Judith Jones for her efficiency in running both the members-only raffle (won by Sheila Chapman, at whose request it was re-drawn at the January meeting when Nigel Brake was the winner) and the *open* raffle. Thanks to those who donated prizes, as well as everyone else who contributed to a successful evening.

GHS also takes this opportunity to thank Diane Walker and her staff at Llancaiach Fawr, not only for ensuring the refreshments had a distinctly Christmas flavour, but also for their efforts accommodating our needs throughout the year

Friday 24 January – There were two events in Gelligaer.

GHS was well represented in the sizeable crowd that gathered in Gelligaer Square at 11.30 am to hear Dr. Elin Jones outline the life of *Llywelyn Bren, our Forgotten Hero!* before CCBC Mayor, Councillor Julian Simmonds, unveiled the memorial. This photograph shows Dr. Elin Jones and Chris Jones-Jenkins on either side of the memorial. The information board includes Chris Jones-Jenkins's reconstruction



drawing of the area at the time of Llywelyn Bren (the original drawing hangs in the nearby Health Centre) and is mounted on a stand constructed from oak from Llancaiach. Oak from the same source was used for the plaques presented to those

involved in the project (including Drs. Stuart Broonfield and Elin Jones of GHS). After the unveiling, those attending were invited to Harp Inn to enjoy a warming tasty bowl of cawl following by bara brith and Caerphilly cheese.

At 7 pm, GHS members were among the large congregation in St. Catwg's Church, Gelligaer, for the **Plygain** (traditional Welsh carols) organised by Dr. Elin Jones. A number of groups and individuals took part, singing old Welsh carols unaccompanied in this ancient church. The carol composed by Sir Huw Dafydd, the rector of Gelligaer in the 1520s, was performed in the church for the first time in centuries.

GHS January meeting – Following the practice of recent years, the meeting started at 11am. The meeting opened with a tribute to late Vida Holley, a much-respected long-time member of this Society. Carolyn Jacob, well-known to many for her work in Merthyr Library for many years, gave an interesting talk entitled *An update on the obituaries project (which includes parish of Gelligaer)*. That was followed by lunch and conversation in the café, and, about 1.30 pm, the audience returned to the Barn to listen to Steve Brewer speak on *Lost buildings of Merthyr*. Both talks were very interesting as witnessed by the audience questions and comments.

Thursday 30 January – GHS was represented at CCBC's **commemoration of Holocaust Memorial Day** at Penallta House when Holocaust Survivor, Dr Martin Stern, spoke of his personal experience of the Holocaust.

TRIBUTE TO LATE VIDA HOLLEY

Her many friends in the Society were saddened to hear of the passing of Vida Holley in January 2020. A kind and friendly lady, Vida was highly respected within GHS and elsewhere. She worked behind the scenes to support local history researches. Long-standing members of the Society will recall the delicious home-made mince pies she brought to Society December meetings when they were held in Bargoed Library. On behalf of officers, committee and members of GHS, a message of sympathy was sent to her husband Fred and son John, and the Society was represented at the funeral.

The world is a poorer place for her passing.

GHS PROJECTS

GHS WWI project closed in winter 2018-19, but the database of names on local war memorials is still on the Society website and any additional information available can be added.

GHS is very pleased to hear that not only is Mansel Powell currently using the database of names of WWI casualties on **Pontlottyn War Memorial** but will contact the Society with additional information that he uncovered. Recently, an Ystrad Mynach resident gifted the following three Gelligaer Urban District Council publications to GHS

1. Abstract of Accounts for the year ended 31 March 1938

Chairman of GUDC – Councillor Richard Williams, J.P., Tirphil

Chairman of GUDC Finance Committee – Councillor W. J. Morgan, Bargoed

GUDC Treasurer C. J. Samuel, who issued this document, subject to audit, in October 1938. *Cyril John Samuel and his wife, Sarah, were listed in The Graig, Hengoed, in the 1939 Register. Born in Pembrokeshire on 1 September 1879, he was one of the sons of Baptist Minister, David Samuel, and his wife Annie (née Lewis). When the 1881 census was taken, he was with his mother and siblings in the household of his maternal grandparents in Rock Villa, Saundersfoot, while his father (Baptist minister at Saundersfoot) was listed as a visitor in a household in Lampeter Velfrey (perhaps he had been taking Sunday services in the chapel there). The birthplaces of his siblings suggest the family lived in the Oystermouth area in the mid 1880s before moving to Llangyfelach where they were at the time of the 1891 and 1901 censuses. In the former, Cyril John Samuel is listed as a scholar while by the time of the latter he was a solicitor's clerk. His whereabouts at the time of the 1911 census are unclear. His marriage to Sarah Jones was registered in Merthyr Tydfil registration district in the June quarter 1912. Research in the local press and/or GUDC records in Glamorgan Archives may shed more light on his service for GUDC. His death was registered in East Glamorgan registration district in March quarter 1960.*

2. Treasurer's Accounts 1965-66

Chairman of GUDC – Councillor Douglas Williams, J.P.

Chairman of GUDC Finance Committee – Councillor D. B. Cooke

GUDC Treasurer – Walter Hicks, O.B.E., F.I.M.T.A., F.S.A.A. This, his eighth Abstract of Accounts, was submitted on 6 June 1966. After nearly nine years' service to GUDC, he retired on 31 March 1967.

3. Treasurer's accounts 1966-67

Chairman of GUDC – Councillor Algina Williams, J.P.

Chairman of GUDC Finance Committee – Councillor D. B. Cooke

GUDC Treasurer – H. E. B. Matthews, F.I.M.T.A., who took over as treasurer on 1 April 1967, submitted his first Abstract of Accounts on 8 June 1967.

Each of these booklets offer interesting insights into GUDC's activities at the time.




HOW, WHERE AND WHEN TO SEE THE BIRDS OF MALLORCA



